The long-awaiting community centre is coming to Love's Farm. It will be situated just to the north of the Tesco/ Barnardo's car park, and include a large hall, meeting room, kitchen, open-plan seating area, office and garden. The site will also house a new preschool with provision for 26 children. The work is due to commence in September, with completion early 2015.

Buses to and from Love's Farm are changing again from 23rd February. The 62 bus will be discontinued and replaced by the 63 and 64. Buses will no longer serve Stone Hill, but will serve a wider range of destinations, including Tesco, Eaton Socon and Eaton Ford. Buses will operate either clockwise (route 63) or anticlockwise (route 64) around the Loves Farm/Eynesbury loop every other hour.
