5	Stone Hill grass cutting - council response Barry and the District Council has visited Stone Hill and agreed that it should be reclassified from a verge to landscaping, which greatly changes the amount of grass cutting during the year. Subsequently, the District Council have emailed Marcus, highlighting the fact that mistakes were made in the planning. Suggesting some remedial redesign, some removal of block paving, an option to convert some of the verges to parking. Lessons learned to be carried forward to Love's Farm 2.
